Why we want you

What you will be doing

- Caring for Blue Cross dogs and providing a safe environment in your own home until they can be rehomed
- Collecting your dog from Blue Cross each evening and returning them the next morning. There is also a possibility of keeping your dog for longer durations at home when needed, such as weekends
- Supporting dogs who might be struggling to cope with kennel life, undergoing behaviour related training or those recuperating from operations
- Providing all the care they need including feeding, socialising, administering medication, grooming and cleaning. This may also include following behaviour programmes

The skills you need

- Previous experience and knowledge of caring for dogs and a keen interest in their welfare
- The ability to drop your dog off at one of our Blue Cross sites daily between the hours of 8:30am and 5pm
- Access to outside space for toileting and exercising your dog
- Willingness to learn and follow Blue Cross procedures and undertake training provided
- The ability to provide timely and regular communication with our foster teams through phone or email
- Time to dedicate towards training, socialising and caring for your dog
